### Garden Lesson Plans for Hands-on Learning - KidsGardening

Plan lessons based on each section of the food pyramid, and discuss why that food group is important to the children's health. Another idea may be to create a large blank food pyramid. Allow children to cut out pictures of different foods from cooking and home magazines and glue them into the correct section of the pyramid.

### What Makes Us Grow? Preschool Lesson Plan for Nutrition ...

Cut out a large paper leaf from the chart or butcher paper. Hang the leaf so it attaches to the flower paper from the previous lesson. Before planting the seeds, spread newspaper on the desk or table where students will be planting. Write each student's name on a wooden tongue depressor or flat wooden stick.

### Get Ready to Grow: A Collection of Seed Lesson Plans ...

Now, students will have the chance to grow their own plant. Give each student a pot, soil, seeds, and water. Explain to them that first they must put soil in the pot. Then, give each student three seeds to place in the dirt. Have them cover the seeds with soil. Ask students what the plant needs to grow.
