## **Striae Atrophicae**

Striae distensae results from cracks in the connective tissue forming atrophic dermal scars underneath an atrophic epidermal layer. The pathophysiology of striae distensae is not fully understood. Likely factors include genetics, hormones (especially corticosteroids) and mechanical stress to tissues.

Striae are also common after prolonged use of topical or systemic corticosteroids. In 1935, Parkes Weber reported an unusual presentation of striae that he called "idiopathic striae atrophicae of puberty."<sup>1</sup> This form of striae occurs in healthy, nonobese individuals around the time of puberty.

### **Idiopathic striae atrophicae of puberty | CMAJ**

Infrequently, striae may indicate the presence of a more concerning medical condition such as Cushing disease or overuse of systemic or topical corticosteroids. Clinically striae appear initially as asymmetric, raised, red linear streaks (striae rubrae) that tend to flatten and lighten over time.

The factors implicated in the formation of striae atrophicae by these various authors may be summarized as follows :- (i) Stretching of the skin due either to rapid skeletal growth, rapid increase of fat or to posture. (2) Malnutrition. (3) Toxaemia. (4) Pituitary disorder. (5) A viscerocutaneous reflex. (6) Constitutional or 'Idiopathic'.
