Signs and symptoms Have a high degree of suspicion for a VAE in a CVAD patient with acute and sudden onset of: • Dyspnea, continuous coughing, breathlessness, tachypnea, wheezing • Chest pain, tachyarrhythmia, hypotension

### Complications of Central Vascular Access Devices

Other signs may include breaking out in a cold sweat, nausea or lightheadedness As with men, women's most common heart attack symptom is chest pain or discomfort. But women are somewhat more likely than men to experience some of the other common symptoms, particularly shortness of breath, nausea/vomiting, and back or jaw pain.

Other symptoms and signs of peripheral artery disease include: Numbness of the legs or feet Weakness and atrophy (diminished size and strength) of the calf muscle A feeling of coldness in the legs or feet

### Peripheral Vascular Disease Treatment, Symptoms, Signs & Risks

Symptoms are usually vague and easily misinterpreted as normal discomfort after the procedure. Early signs include flank or lower abdominal pain, lower back pain, and possibly leg or flank bruising. Late symptoms are more obvious and include hypotension, tachycardia, and an obvious drop in hemoglobin.

The sensitivity of vital signs to even subtle changes in the client's condition is so effective that vital signs are routinely taken for all acute care clients on a regular and ongoing basis. Physiologically, the vital signs reflect the adequacy or inadequacy of basic bodily functions.

### Changes and Abnormalities in Vital Signs: NCLEX-RN ...

Assess the vascular access for signs and symptoms of infection such as redness, warmth, tenderness, purulent drainage, open sores, or swelling. Patients with end-stage kidney disease are at increased risk of infection. After dialysis, assess the vascular access for any bleeding or hemorrhage.

Symptoms. Vascular dementia symptoms vary, depending on the part of your brain where blood flow is impaired. Indicators of location or degree of cerebral circulation or perfusion are alteration in cognition and speech content. Gastrointestinal. Examine GI function, noting anorexia, decreased or absent bowel sounds, nausea or vomiting, abdominal distension, and constipation.

Some of the signs and symptoms include hemodynamic compromise, unconsciousness, angina chest pain, palpitations, shortness of breath, dizziness, syncope, hypotension, and the absence of a pulse or a rapid pulse rate. Additionally, the client may not have any signs or symptoms when there are less than 30 seconds of ventricular tachycardia.
